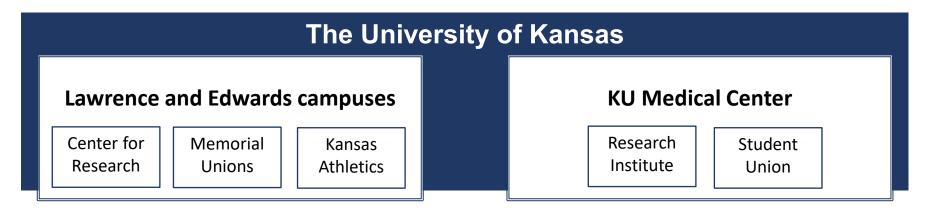

Lawrence Campus FY 2025 Mid-Year Updates:

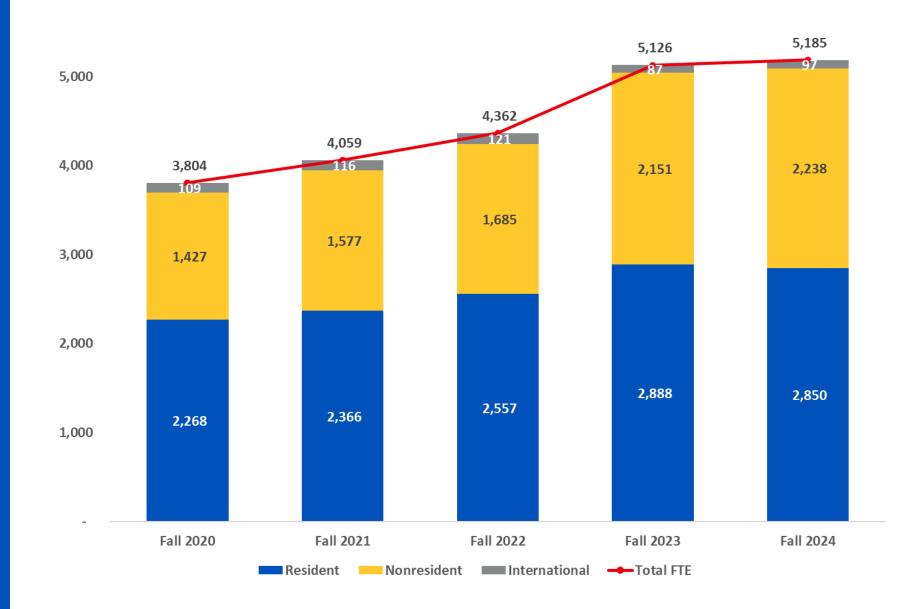
- Largest freshman class in KU history
- University total enrollment is the largest in KU history
- Fall 2025 applications to date indicate another strong freshman class
- FY2025 General Use budget and five-year financial plan balanced through several strategic initiatives
- Campus masterplan completed
- Phase I of the Gateway Stadium project under construction to be completed August 2025 (ARPA, donor, Athletics)

Medical Center Campus FY 2024 Mid-Year Updates:

- Enrollment remains steady
- Research enterprise continues strong growth
- New Cancer Center project underway for a joint clinical and research facility
- New Wichita Biomedical Education Campus project proceeding in collaboration with Wichita State

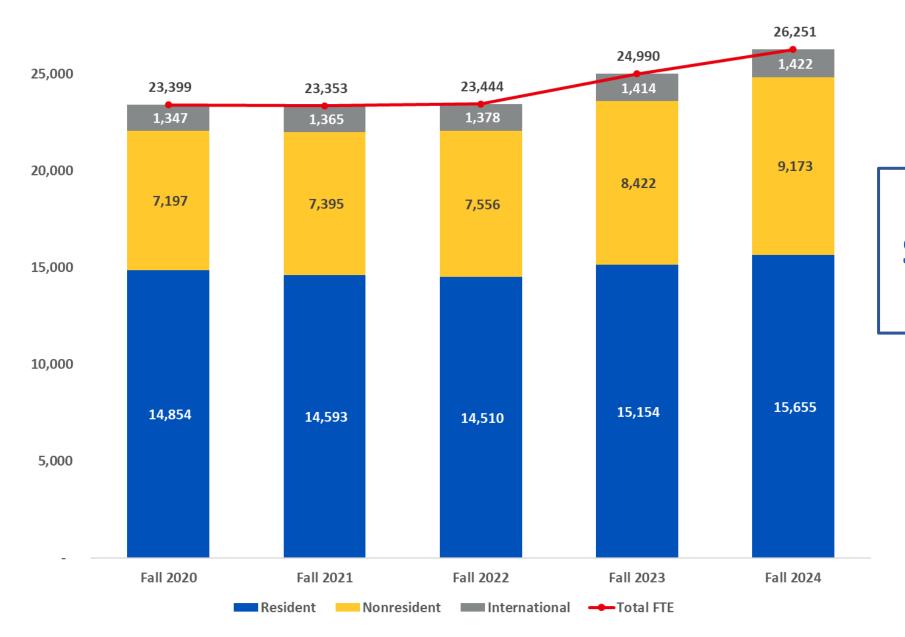
Largest Freshman Class Ever in Fall 2024

University Wide Student FTE (Fall 2020-Fall 2024)

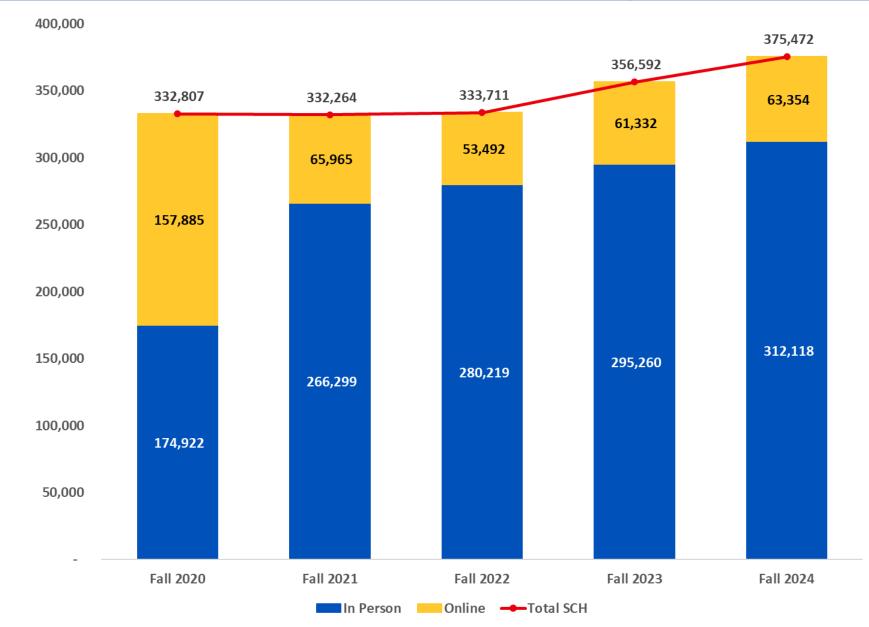

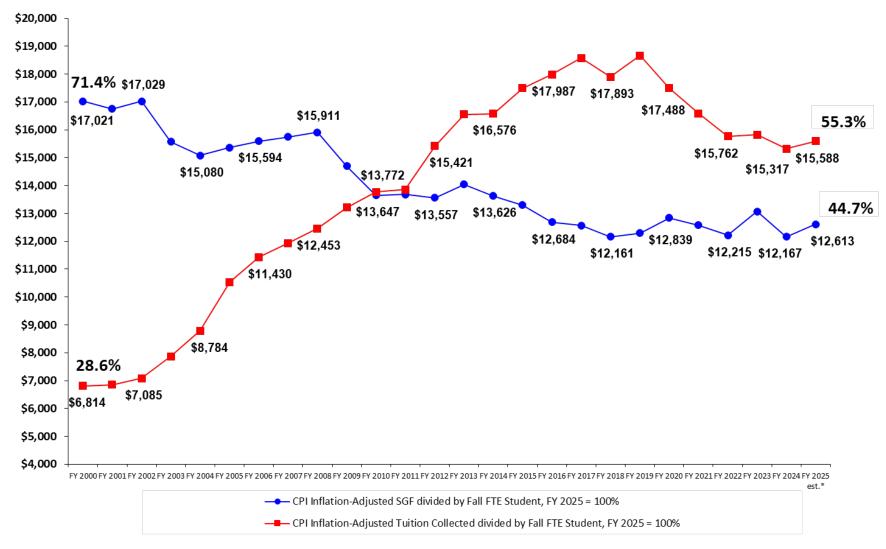

Fall Student Credit Hour Production (Fall 2020 – Fall 2024)



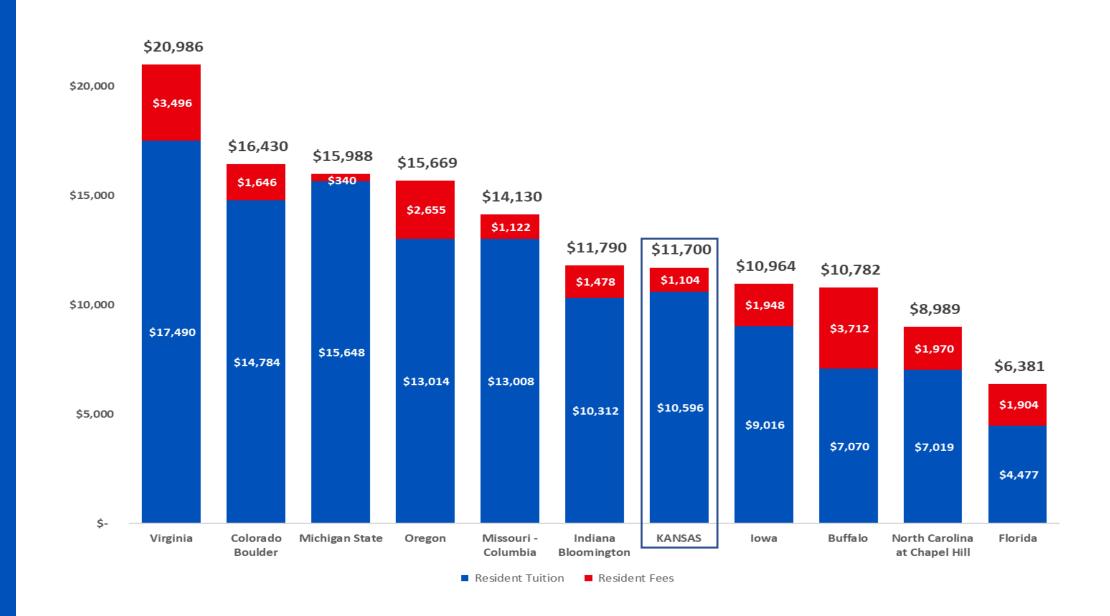
Students Shoulder Larger Portion of Educational Cost

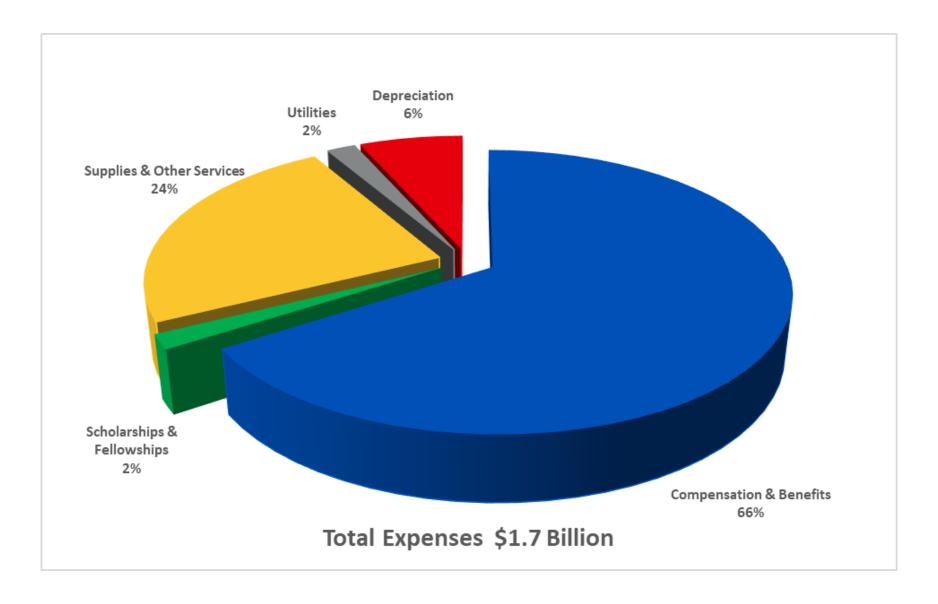

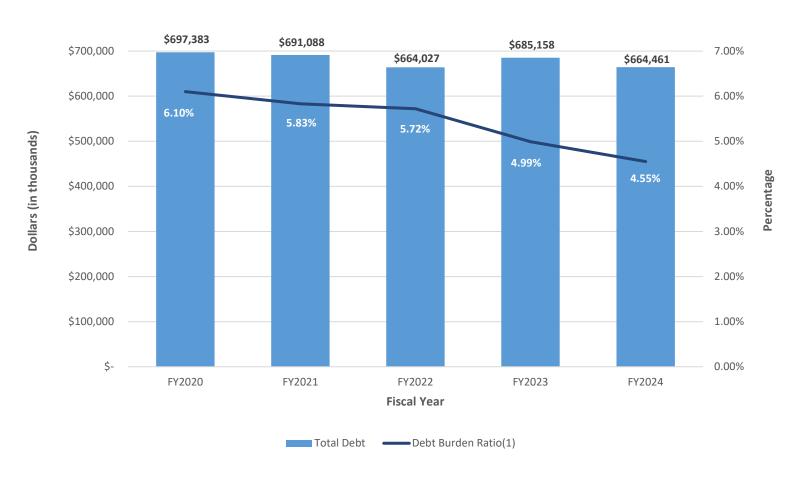

FY 2024 Expenditures by Type - Consolidated



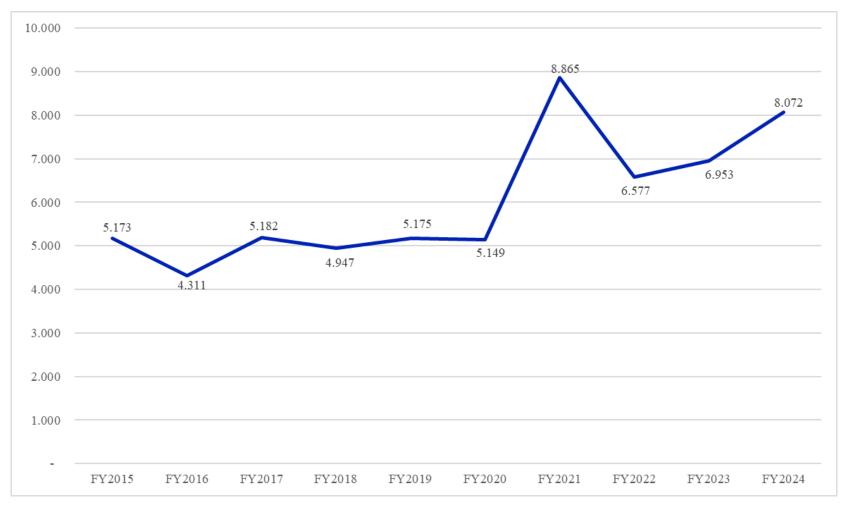
Historical Total Debt & Debt Burden

⁽¹⁾ The debt burden ratio is calculated by taking the principal and interest payments for all debt for the year divided by total expenses, excluding depreciation, plus principal payments. KU's policy states this ratio cannot exceed 7%.

Key University-Wide Fiscal Challenges

- State funding levels?
- Uncertainty of Federal funding (grants/student aid)
- Faculty and staff recruitment and retention addressing market pay gaps for all employee groups
- Cybersecurity threats and rapidly changing IT environment
- Facility upgrades, maintenance, and new facilities
- Addressing on-campus student housing needs on the Lawrence campus
- National court case related to athletics (House v. NCAA)
